A Community Center Update!

Thanks to the generous support of friends like you, we have reached the halfway point of our \$8.5 million Capital Campaign goal, bringing us closer to moving all of our services over to the new building, under one roof. This will allow us to serve more people and eliminate transportation barriers for clients accessing services scattered across various buildings. We're grateful and thank God for the funds raised, seeing this project as an answer to prayer.

Moreover, our partners at Isaiah House finished renovations on the third floor, where they will operate a behavioral health and primary care clinic!

- · A new kitchen and dining room
- A café for staff to build relationships with guests



om spent 17 years in the military serving his country, 13 of those years in Special Forces. "I never had a problem with alcohol growing up or when I was in the military." he says. "But when I started having PTSD nightmares, I started drinking to push that down."

When the drinking didn't work, Tom turned to drugs, and finally to rehab.

"I got out of rehab, but I just knew I wasn't ready to go home yet. I had already started this journey of getting closer to Christ, and I wanted to go somewhere to help me continue that journey," he remembers.

Thanks to your support, that place was Lexington Rescue Mission. Tom's first stay was seven months, and during that time he got a job and an apartment. "I was doing great," he says. When he lost his painting business during Covid, you made it possible for the Mission to help again.

"I feel like I have a purpose now."

"When I first came in, I was like, 'A couple of weeks is all I need.' And they said, 'We don't care how long you need." Tom started working

with the Mission's lawn care team and was then offered a job as house coordinator for our House of Hope, a sober living home for men who are trying to get back on their feet.

"I fell in love with this place the first time I was here," Tom says. "Now they've given

the right way. Everybody here will do what they can to make sure you succeed."

Today, Tom is back in school working for his certification as a drug and alcohol counselor, with the goal of helping others facing the problems he

has overcome.
